# Critical Art Ensemble:

In conjunction with SEIZED, an evening of shorts by Critical Art Ensemble (CAE) and a look back at the juvenilia of the collective These rarely seen films were intended to be parts of larger multimedia events, and are extremely awkward works emblematic of the group's struggle to harmonize the dialogue between theory and practice. Although CAE has recently used video once again, when the Web went on-line in 1993 CAE abandoned video in favor of graphic user interfaces. APOCALYPSE AND UTOPIA was the last video that CAE made: five theorists (Autonomedia Collective, Arthur and Marilouise Kroker, Greg Ulmer, Tom Kalin, and CAE) attempt to live theoretical interpretations of culture in this 'associational documentary
